Example

Jehovah Witnesses believe that they are the only true visible representation of God on earth and that the Watchtower Society was established as His visible representatives on earth. "Without the Watchtower Society, people are utterly unable to understand or interpret the Holy Scriptures." They site the example of Philip's encounter with the Eunuch who asked Philip to explain a passage of scripture he was reading. This is used to support their view that there is a need for an organization to help explain scriptures

Answer: If we closely examine the scriptures we will see that the Eunuch did ask for help in understanding the scripture, but it did not require him to join and organization and/or submit to its teaching. In fact, after that meeting, he never saw Philip again. Philip also used the bible alone to explain the scripture...it did not require another text or manuscript to explain its meaning. If the bible alone was sufficient for Philip and the Eunuch...should it not also be sufficient for us?
